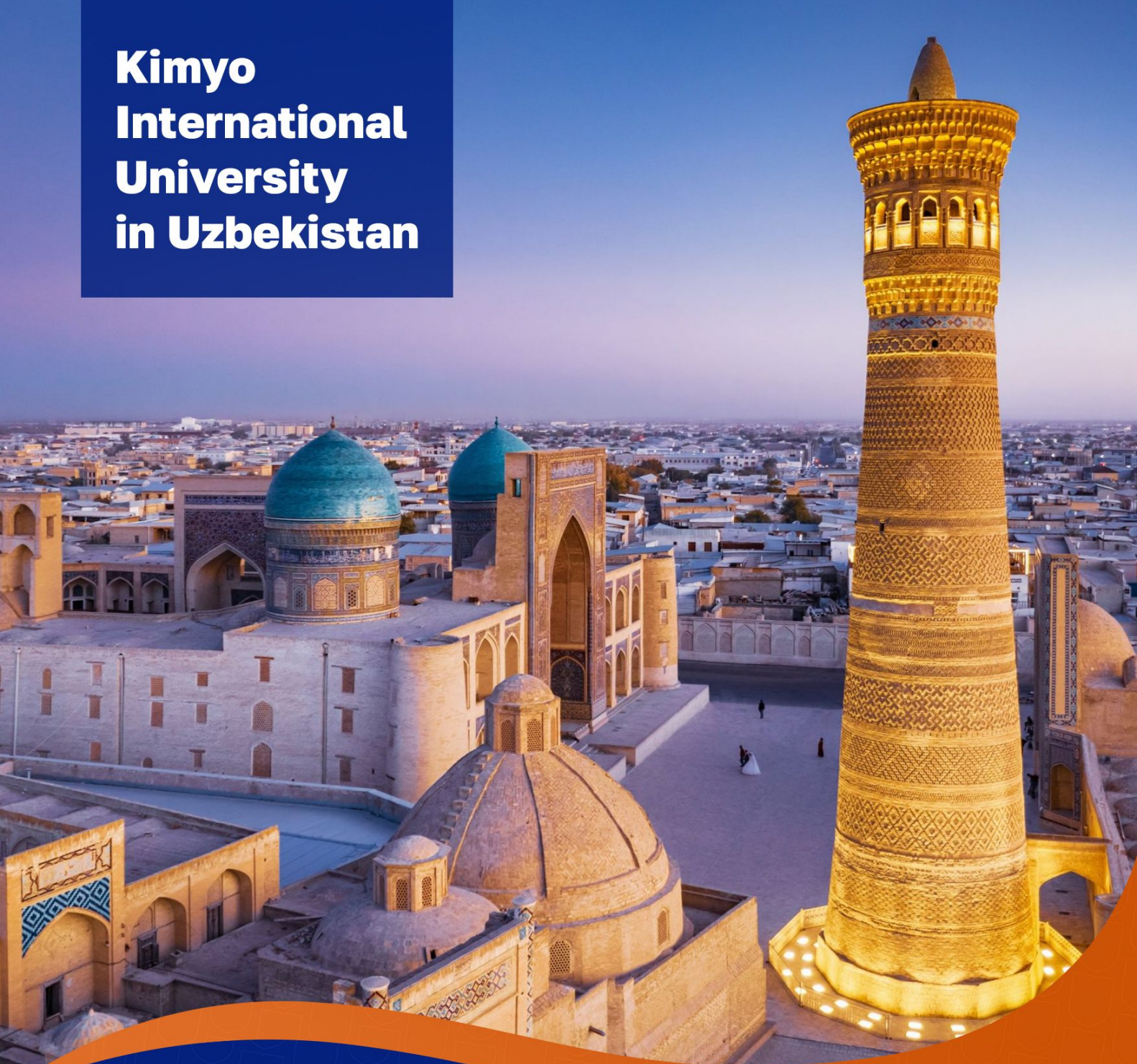

Program Duration (2 weeks)

Location: Tashkent, Uzbekistan + Excursions to Ancient Cities

Program Overview

This immersive two-week summer school program at Kimyo International University offers Korean students the opportunity to develop Uzbek language skills and experience Uzbekistan's rich culture and history. Participants will engage in structured language classes, cultural workshops, and guided excursions to historical sites, ensuring a perfect balance of academic learning and cultural exploration.



Detailed Two-Week Schedule

Monday - Friday: Academic & Cultural Learning

Each weekday consists of a combination of structured academic learning and cultural immersion activities.

9:00 AM – 12:30 PM | Uzbek Language Classes

- Introduction to Uzbek Alphabet & Pronunciation
- Basic Conversational Uzbek (Greetings, Daily Life)
- Practical Language Skills (Shopping, Transportation, Food)
- Grammar & Writing Exercises
- Listening & Speaking Practice with Local Students
- Group Projects: Role-Playing Real-Life Situations

12:30 PM – 2:00 PM | Lunch Break

Week 1

- Traditional Uzbek Music & Dance – Learning folk dances like "Lazgi" and "Andijan Polka."
- Uzbek Calligraphy & Handicrafts – Crafting miniature paintings and suzani embroidery.
- History & Traditions of Uzbekistan – Interactive discussions with local historians.
- Cooking Class: Uzbek Cuisine – Preparing Plov, Somsa, and Shashlik.
- Language Exchange & Games with Local Students

Week 2

- Introduction to Silk Road Heritage – Insights into Uzbekistan's historical significance.
- Fashion & Textiles Workshop – Learning about ikat fabric and national dress.
- Storytelling & Folklore – Traditional Uzbek myths and legends.
- Tea Culture & Hospitality – Experiencing the art of Uzbek chai ceremonies.
- Closing Performance Rehearsal – Preparing for final presentations.

- Registan Square: Discovering the architectural wonders of the Silk Road.
- Shah-i-Zinda Mausoleum: Exploring a sacred pilgrimage site.
- Bibi-Khanym Mosque & Gur-e-Amir Mausoleum: Learning about Timurid history.

- Visiting Siyob Bazaar for a hands-on market experience.
- Meeting local artisans and observing traditional crafts.

Farewell Celebration

- Group dinner, reflection session, and certificate distribution.
